

LESSON:

Our ears can get us into trouble when we listen to gossip, to untruths, or things that will drown out the voice of Jesus. Let’s pray to listen and hear the sweet, still, small voice of our Savior.

MUSIC:

As we continue to learn that **God Made Me**, keep singing “Be Careful Little Ears” to your children. This is, in fact, a song I sang to my children many a night, many years, many times. Even adults need to remember to be mindful of what we say, where we go, what we listen to, watch and so on. The truths behind this song never get old. And as mentioned last time, it’s fun to have the children point to the body part as we sing about it. If you still don’t know the tune, look it up on YouTube and you’ll know it in no time at all.

 So, be careful little ears what you hear*

Repeat the song, trading out the verses:

*O be careful little eyes what you see...
 O be careful little hands what you do...
 O be careful little feet where you go...
 O be careful little mouth what you say...*
