

### DAY ONE

God is the Divine Author of the Bible.

Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Galatians 1:11-12; and John 17:17.

God is the author of Scripture. All truth comes from Him and He has breathed out His words so that we may know Him and what is true. God used men as the vessels by which His words were written, but these men were divinely inspired by God. Since God is truth and the Bible is His Word, the Bible contains all truth. We can trust Scripture to guide us in truth because it is the very words of God.

### DAY TWO

God used men to write down His truthful words.

Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Numbers 12:6-8; and 1 Corinthians 2:12-13.

Inspiration God-breathed; God inspired people to write the Scriptures. (2

Timothy 3:16)

What's a favorite book you've read? Most books are great because the author really knows how to tell a good story. However, there is only one Author whose book tells a story that is the source of all truth. God used people to actually write down His words, but these people communicated exactly what God wanted them to. Through the Holy Spirit, God used men like a vessel to write down the words in the Bible and give us a book that helps us to know what is true.

## DAY THREE

God's Word was preserved and is eternal.

Read Hebrews 1:1-2; Psalm 12:6-7; Proverbs 3:5-6; Psalm 119:89; and Matthew 24:35.

God spoke to Moses and the prophets and later sent His Son to speak truth. These words were kept pure, inerrant, and everlasting. The words are everlasting because God is eternal. God does not change. Therefore, since all truth comes from God, truth does not change. We can't change Scripture to fit our own ideas or beliefs, though some have tried. We must

take the Bible for what it says.

DAY FOUR	
Jesus believed Scripture is the Word of God.	
• Read Matthew 5:17-18; Mark 7:9-13; Matthew 4:1-11; and Hebrews 4:12.	
Jesus believed the Bible was the authoritative Word of God. He did not question its truthfulness. Jesus taught from the Scriptures. He used the Scripture as the foundation for truth and to reveal the truth to others. He even used Scripture to fight temptation and believed it was able to judge the thoughts of the hearts.
